Exposure to these sort of games are hugely important in our players' development and this is why it was such a great achievement to seal a top-four spot and book further fixtures against Swansea and Cardiff.

As we showed in last week's narrow defeat to Swansea, the gap between us is not insurmountable and I know Steve and the players are keen to prove that on the pitch in Phase Two.

After today, we face Swansea again next Sunday (March 24), and what a brilliant occasion that promises to be.

The match, at the STōK Cae Ras, will be the first time Wrexham AFC Women have played at the world's oldest international football stadium since the record-breaking crowd of 9,511 watched last season's win against Connah's Quay Nomads.

Our standard admission price for women's games this season remains - £3 for adults and £1 for under-16s, and tickets can be booked on our eTicketing website

It will be great to see another good crowd and fantastic atmosphere to celebrate what the team have achieved this season and hopefully to roar them on to greater things to come.

Among those big things to come will be another fixture against Cardiff City at the end of the season, on May 5 in the Bute

We learned this week that the fixture will take place at Rodney Parade and will be televised live on S4C.

We hope as many of you as possible will be able to cheer on the team that day as they look to win the Welsh Cup for the first

Thank you all for your support. I look forward to seeing you all at the STōK Cae Ras next weekend for the match against Swansea.

While Bolland is yet to appear in Phase Two of the Genero **Adran Premier** campaign, she is ready to take any opportunity that arises.

Speaking ahead of the match, the 23-year-old said: "I'm really excited. It is a great game to be a part of and a good test, so hopefully we can give them a good game and get a result.

"They've been tricky games against Cardiff in the past, but I don't think that we are far off. Every game that we've played against them, there have been aspects where we have given them a go and could've nicked a result.

While today's match against Cardiff is the first home fixture of Phase Two, Wrexham still have another four matches to play in the competition after facing the Bluebirds, with the addition of a Bute Energy Welsh Cup final against the Bluebirds in May.

Bolland admitted that it was a great time to be a part of the Club, and expressed her joy at being a part of the side.

She said: "It's so exciting - every game is going to be tough, but we all generally believe that we can beat any of the teams in this league on our day.

'It's been nuts (since joining), but it has been great. I've enjoyed it and everyone has been so welcoming and supportive. I'm just happy.

"When I'm getting a start I'm really happy, but even when I'm not starting, I'm just happy to be a part of this team to be honest."

The keeper admitted that the Welsh women's game has improved massively, having previously been involved in the Welsh leagues with Connah's Quay Nomads.

Bolland said: "Even compared to when I was at Connah's Quay two years ago, it is unbelievable, with the attendances, all the social media, what we are doing at the Club and then what Cardiff and Swansea are also doing, too.

"Everyone is pushing in the right direction and no one is shying away from that either. It's really good to see the standards picking up and the media side of things picking up too. There are more fans wanting to come and watch us and that is always great."

The past week has been a whirlwind for all involved at Wrexham AFC Women, as the Club announced that they would take part in the Wrex Coast Tour 2024.

Upon hearing the news, the 23year-old said: "I couldn't believe it when they said it. I had little inklings that something like that might happen, but when you think - just a group of girls from Wrexham and the surrounding areas going off to the US, it is amazing. It's going to be such a good experience and the Club can only go upwards from there.

"It is unbelievable, how many women's teams can truly say that they are semi-professionals, and then on top of that, to be able to do things like the US.

"It shows that the Club is setting an example, which hopefully other clubs can follow. We don't want to be the only ones able to do this sort of stuff. Everyone should have an opportunity to do something like this.

"If you have people that are backing you from the very top, then there is no limit to what you can do - it fills you with such confidence."

While the tour is set to be an incredible experience for all involved, Bolland also admitted just how much it means to her to inspire the younger generation.

She explained: "I'm so happy to be a part of this.

"I was amazed as I spoke to quite a few little girls at the games, but the amount of boys that are coming up to you and saying 'keeper can you sign

"I'm thinking to myself that we actually are now not just inspiring little girls, but a generation of football fans too.

"When I was vounger. growing up, it always used to be that girls watched women's football, and boyswatched 'football'.

"However, now I'm here, and it is growing so much. It is brilliant to be a part of, and it is always great to get that support.'

THE ONE TO WATCH KERRY WALKLETT



A newcomer to South Wales, Walklett is a vastlyexperienced senior player within the squad, having only joined in the most recent transfer window.

While her experiences within the English game stand out, it is in fact her recent inclusion in the England futsal side which makes her such a unique player.

Walklett is often found in midfield for the Bluebirds, but she initially played futsal as a break from the regular rigours of 11-a-side football.

However, her recent call up gives the 28-year-old an opportunity to represent England in the upcoming World Cup qualifiers alongside her playing commitments for Cardiff.

She is yet to score, but given her vast experiences, Walklett could prove to be a vital asset for City.

GOALKEEPERS

CERYN CHAMBERLAIN – An integral part to a side who are yet to concede a goal in the league so far this competition. Young was nominated for the League's young player of the year award in 2019.

DEFENDERS

LISA OWEN – Another great club servant, Owen joined in 2014 and has been a key component ever since, providing an important defensive platform for the side to build from.

HANNAH POWER - One of the side's longest-serving players having joined in 2015. Into her second spell with the club and has played in every game so far this campaign.

MEGAN BOWEN - Bowen joined Cardiff from Barry Town United in the summer of 2022 and enjoyed an impressive 2022/23 season, where she was named Cardiff's Young Player of the Season.

DANIELLE GREEN - Green originally signed for the Bluebirds as a winger, but has become a versatile and experienced figure, having been at the club for over ten years.

FFION PRICE - Lifelong Cardiff City fan who has been with the club since 2020, having made the switch from Cyncoed. Has since established herself as a key component to Cardiff's impressive backline as a well-rounded full-back.

MIKAYLA COOK – Young defender who was promoted from the club's U19 programme in the summer.

SIOBHAN WALSH - One of Cardiff's longest serving players, joining the club in 2011. One of a select few to be involved with Cardiff's 2014 Champions League adventure that were involved with the Bluebirds' last appearance in the competition this summer. Has also scored five times in the league this season.

MIDFIELDERS

KELLY ADAMS – Highly-experienced midfielder who joined in the summer from Swansea City and has impressed for lain Darbyshire's side since arriving at the club.

TIJA RICHARDSON – Six-time winner of the Genero Adran Premier, who has previously played for Swansea City and Cardiff Met. Joined the club this summer to add some much-needed experience to a youthful side.

EMMA BENYON – Ex-Swansea City player who crossed the South Wales divide after not being offered a contract in the summer. Vast experience in the Genero Adran Premier and European football.

KERRY WALKLETT - SEE ONE TO WATCH

SEREN WATKINS - Goalscoring midfielder who has come into her own this season, contributing a number of key long-range goals to assist in the Bluebirds' battle to claim the Genero Adran Premier title for the second season in a row.

FORWARDS

MACKENZIE OLDEN – Olden joined Cardiff from local side Barry Town United, having broken through into the first team at Jenner Park despite her young age. The 19-year-old scored nine goals in the Genero Adran Premier last season.

RHIANNE OAKLEY – Another player who crossed the South Wales divide to move from Swansea to Cardiff. Since making the move in July 2022, Oakley has been an efficient attacking outlet and a key part of their title winning side last season.

ELIZA COLLIE – Young forward who had an impressive goalscoring record for the club's Under-19 side in the 2021/22 season, scoring 31 goals over the course of the season. Collie finished Phase One as the third-highest scorer in the league, netting 11 goals.

MOLLY KEHOE – Kehoe is a Cayman Islands international who is only all too familar to Wrexham, having scored three times against the Red Dragons this season.
